Mark Miller and the Cold Wind

Vocalist/guitarist **Mark Miller** has loved music since he was a kid when he fondly remembers traveling with his grandparents during the summer and being exposed to gospel music in churches. "I had a great childhood and wonderful education, Mark notes. "I'd sit down with someone and I'd take (learn) something from them. "It (music) is great therapy; a great escape," he says. "It's a great way for me to share something with someone I've never met. You get the same feelings, the same experiences. It's a great way to know I'm not alone in this humongous universe."

Mark has signed with Tulsa record label *White Fang Entertainment* and plans to release an album this spring. He formed his current band, **Mark Miller and the Cold Wind** about six or seven months ago. On bass is **Randy Sparkman**, whom Mark met about six years ago when they were members of the band **Sticks and Stones**. They eventually left that group and paired up for a project Mark was starting "and we've been buddies ever since.

The band has had a couple of drummers who left because of pressing family matters and now aboard is veteran **Randy "Mr. Dobie" Reese**, who is a fixture in the Tulsa music scene. "Randy's doing a great job. He's a great drummer and a real solid guy," Mark says. **(continued on page 5)**

7th Harmonica Summit Bringing in Heavy Hitters for March 19th Show

Even though the annual Harmonica Summit has moved from the Oklahoma Jazz Hall of Fame this year to the Hyatt Regency at 100 E. 2nd St. in downtown Tulsa, renown Tulsa musician **David Berntson** says it will still have a lot of great workshops, not to mention heavy hitting harmonica players.

David, along with **Jimmy "Junior" Markham** are board members and founders of the Route 66 Harmonica Club, which is presenting the show. They are joined by the club's president **Brian Walker.**

Among the headlining performers are multi-award winning artists **Billy Gibson** from Memphis. **R.J. Mischo**, who now lives in Ventura, CA, plus **Deake Harp** from Clarksdale, Ms, Sugar Blue and Johnny Long.

Deak has a popular one-man band, but also is known for his harmonica emporium in Clarksdale. He also puts on a Mississippi "saxophone" Festival, with a sax really being a harp in that part of the country. (Continued on page 2)

As for the pending new album release, Mark calls it "blues fusion," for lack of a better term. It is not traditional blues, or rock.

"If blues could grow up and become what rock has become, I think that is what blues would be today," he says.

Mark, who performs a lot in Indiana says some people there believe the band has a Tulsa sound, but adds with a laugh,

"my buddies there say it sounds like Okie rock slobber." Although he's reluctant to categorize his sound, Mark admits, "I may have a Tulsa sound, and rock with a heavy blues influence."

Major musical influences of Mark's range from Howlin' Wolf to Robert Johnson. Mark also has a special love for the slide guitar mentioning such slide stalwarts as slide pioneer Elmore James, Eric Clapton, Billy Gibbons of ZZ Top, Frank Marino of Mahogany Rush, Jeff Healy, Alvin Lee and last, but certainly not least Duane Allman.

"Nobody could make the slide sound like him (Duane). I've always been endeared towards slide playing, although I'm not as good at it as I need to be. Duane Allman could play anything on it. That is my hero on slide," Mark states.

As for his deal with *White Fang Entertainment*, Mark says it evolved with forming a friendship and bond with Gerry **James** and **Bill Hoy**.

"It is something I thought would be beneficial to me, my personal journey, and for everyone involved. We get along and like each other. We can joke and criticize one another and tell the truth," he says.

As for that "journey" Mark says that involves "making some noise and getting our music out there."

Continuing he adds, "But first it is whatever God wants. We pray for God to bless what we're doing. I believe Jesus was a rebel and will be right here with us, and bless us, as long as we have good intentions."

Mark has always had a love for the blues, but likes all kinds of music "that has a good message and tells a good story. It's an enjoyment. Something I love. It's just a part of my life and I can't imagine life without it."

Tommy McCoy:25 YEAR RETROSPECT (Earwig Music Company)

Here's a 30 track; two Cd set of rockin' blues originals and covers spanning Tommy's career over the last 25 years. The whole album rocks from top to bottom with outstanding songs; many

Ernest James Zydeco is living proof you don't have be from the Louisiana bayou country to play sizzling good zydeco.


Straight out of Kanas City, this quintet mixes Creole and Cajun southern influences with R&B, rock, country and zydeco into a melting pot of back porch dirt music featuring everything from accordion, guitars, dobro, keys, washboard and drums, among other instruments.

This is EJZ's fourth release for Jam Rat Records, with a previous release, *3 Steps from La La* receiving Grammy consideration. Led by its namesake, EJZ has toured extensively and headlined a Cajun and zydeco festival in the Netherlands. Excellent band and music. – **Bill Martin**

er SAM BUTLER:

Raise Your Hands!

(Severn Records, Inc.)

Former Blind Boys of Alabama guitarist Sam Butler has released an album that has touched my soul as much as about any I have heard. I normally

am skeptical of records full of cover songs, but this is the exception. I'm not sure I'd have even given this CD the time of day except I noticed Sam did *God's Hotel* by one of my favorite artists, **Nick Cave (Grinderman, Bad Seeds)**. I thought, anyone who has the "kahunas" to record a Nick Cave song, deserves a listen.

Other cover tunes are from the creations of Tom Waits, Van Morrision, Johnny Cash, Bruce Springsteen, U2 and Eric Clapton, among others. Sam's vocals are rough, bluesy and tremendous. His guitar playing is incredible. Sam is backed by some of the best: Sacred Steel's Roosevelt Collier, pedal steel guitar; drummer, Marco Giovino (Robert Plant) and bassist Vikktor Kraus (Lyle Lovett, Bill Frisell).

At one time in my life I would have never dreamed the Lord could speak to you through the blues. If you want that tremendous feeling of trials and tribulations lifted and the burdens of life now bearable, try listening to *Raise Your Hands*. If you ever doubted there is a God and there is a heaven, this album should erase it. – **Bill Martin**



Blue Largo: SING YOUR OWN SONG (Coffeegrinds)

The music of **Blue Largo** is straight out of the 1940s and '50s. This traditional blues band with vocalist **Alicia Aragon** reminds me a lot of **Billie Holiday**

and **Dinah Washington.** Band founder and guitarist **Eric Lieberman** pens seven originals of the 14 songs. Based in San Diego, a lot of artists contributed to this fine album featuring everything from up right bass to saxophones, various guitars and percussion. since 1999. Danny also has played in previous bands ranging from **Diamond Back** to Cartel Blues Band.

Rounding out the rhythm section of this power rock, blues, southern jam style group is Marshall Woodson who has drummed for Joshua Yarbrough and The Boogie.

Completing the trio is **Aaron Pride** on guitar, who also distinguished himself on drums with the band **Locus**. He's also been with **Elaborate Hoax**. These days Aaron is proving he is every bit as talented playing a Stratocaster.

During one of its gigs fans may hear anything from Bob Seeger to Creedence Clearwater Revival, Lynard Skynard and the Allman Brothers, plus some original tunes.
