THE DUSTIN PITTSLEY BAND (Horton Records)



I've been in the choir singing the praises of the **Dustin Pittsley Band** for years. I might be prejudiced, but there are many

reasons for all the awards and regional acclaim for this fabulous band. No one is better on the guitar than Dustin. **Donnie Wood** is smooth as silk on the bass, and has been with Dustin many years. More recently they have added two of the finest musicians anywhere in **David Teegarden Jr**. on drums and **Chris Kyle** on keys. Their tightness, dynamics and even material are not matched by anyone else in the region.

I loved their previous CD *Already There*, but their latest release, the self-titled *Dustin Pittsley Band* might be their conduit to stardom. Tracks of note are *Satellite*, lamenting life adrift and *Rare to be Right*, showing the ebb and flow (dynamics) that make this group stand out.

A blues CD is never complete without a haunting ballad like *For the* Ones We Left Behind, which supplies this in spades. Completing the album is the rousing number *Waves Crashing*. This new record has just cracked the Top 25 on The Euro Americana Billboard (all genres of music). So check out these guys new CD. You can be a convert, and join the congregation on a path to glory! – **Freddie Morrow**

Within Tulsa, and throughout most of Oklahoma, **Dustin Pittsley** is widely regarded as one of the best blues-rock guitarists around. After 17 years of playing publically (He first started playing at *The Blue Note* in OKC in '99), Pittsley has stretched beyond the blues and developed into one of the most well-rounded guitarists around. Perhaps it's fitting,

then, that his latest album, the self-titled *Dustin Pittsley Band* (fully reviewed in this issue), is the most well-rounded and natural sounding disc of his career.

Although previous releases like *Palm Trees & Trailer Parks* and *Almost There* represented big leaps in growth for him as an artist, there was an aspect of those records that felt just a little forced to my ears. With *DPB*, Pittsley and his band seem to have found a space that lets them capture that same effortless sound and vibe the live performances have always en-capsulated. (Continued on Page 6)

BILLY'S BLUES

It's pretty amazing how one event can change your life significantly. I was reminded of this recently when my good friend **Jim Moody**,

(Photo by Jim Moody) vice president of the Oklahoma Blues Society and I were talking before a **Doyle Bramhall II** show recently in OKC. Jim's life similarly was affected by that same event I previously referred to.

We did not know each other in 2002 when we attended a **Joe Bonamassa** show at The Tulsa Little Theatre, or whatever it was called then. I was with my best friend Don McDonald. This very talented young kid named **Dustin Pittsley** was the opening act, someone Don and I had seen a time or two. Don was more familiar with Bonamassa and wanted me to see him.

That show made **Jim Moody** an avid Bonamassa fan. It even led to him booking Joe in OKC on several occasions, not to mention a host of other acts, including the previously mentioned **Doyle Bramhall** Show.

When Don and I walked into the theater some 15 years ago, there were four people in the lobby standing behind a small fold up table. They were the Blues Society of Tulsa, which had recently been loosely formed. They were having people fill out contact information for when they came up with a plan for the Blues Society.

To make a long story short, soon Don and I went to Carl's Coney Island in East Tulsa for a BST meeting. The owners were **John and Sharon Eskew**, two of the BST founders.

As a result of that original contact, I became involved later that year. In November 2002 I became editor of the *Blues News*. In March 2003 I was elected president and have been serving in both positions ever since. Don was elected treasurer and we served together in the BST until his passing in October 2012.

Anyway, **Jim Moody** and I shared this story with Bonamassa when the guitar great was in town to play The Brady Theatre last December. The day before his concert, we spent some time with Joe at Cain's Ballroom as he recently purchased the famous Fender Stratocaster once owned by the great **Eldon Shamblin**, guitarist for **Bob Wills and the Texas Playboys**.

It's pretty ironic how one seemingly normal event can lead to so many things you never dreamed would happen.

Today, perhaps Joe is the biggest blues rock draw in the world, something I hope to share some thoughts with you about in a future column. Meanwhile, Happy 15th Birthday to the Blues Society and wishing it 15 more years of promoting the blues and its artists in Northeastern Oklahoma. We'll be recognizing this milestone throughout 2017 – **Bill Martin**

The 13th Annual Blues Choice Award winners for 2016 features multitime winners **Dustin Pittsley Band** on the heels of its recently released, highly acclaimed album, plus some Northeastern Oklahoma artists capturing their first BCA.

Reaffirming its status as a fan favorite the

Dustin Pittsley Band won its 11th BCA for *Best Group*. Namesake of the four-piece band, blues rocker **Dustin Pittsley** also captured his eighth award for *Best Lead* and is now a three-time winner for *Best Vocals*. DPB continues to tour throughout the Midwest and has recently released its sixth record, self-titled *Dustin Pittsley Band*. Dustin had an acoustic tour in Europe in 2014 and looking to do another European tour with his band.

DPB also won the Tulsa Blues Challenge last summer and will be representing Northeastern Oklahoma at the International Blues Challenge in Memphis January 31 – February 4.

Other band members are Donnie Wood, bass (Medicine Show), David Teegarden Jr., drums (Randy Crouch and Flying Horse)

and Chris Kyle, keyboards.

Best Lead: There was a tie in voting for *Best Leads*. Veteran blues rocker and guitarist **Pete Marriott** will accept his first BCA. Pete has a storied career having played with Joe Cocker, touring with **Ritchie** Havens and recorded with **Sandra** Wright on an album that included Warren Haynes (Gov't Mule, Allman Brothers) and Danny Louis (Gov't Mule, Greg Allman and

Friends), as well as the **Jennifer Marriott Band**. Pete released a highly acclaimed album in 2014, *Outrunnin' the Rain*. (Continued on page 5)

Best Rhythm: Four gifted artists will be receiving awards for Best Rhvthm.

Matt Martin toured all 48 states and western Canada as a band member with Reba McIntyre for two years, including January



1983 when Reba had her first number one hit, Can't Even Get the Blues. He's drummed for a number of excellent bands ranging from Glenn R. Townsend to Medicine Show and Brad Absher. A native of Seminole, OK, before making Tulsa home, Matt has been performing since 1973. He currently is playing bass for the James Groves Blues Machine and drums for Christine Jude.

Native Tulsan Chris Kyle got a tiny piano to "clunk around on" when he was two or three years old and there

was no stopping him. Chris keeps quite busy as keyboardist for the Dustin Pittsley Band, but also has his own band Ego Culture, an improv funk fusion instrumental act. He also is a member of Joshua Yarbrough and Memphis Bound. Kris is in high demand as a session player and has appeared, or will be appearing on four albums within a year.

Bassist Kat Irons is a mainstay in the Tulsa music scene. She's currently playing in four bands and can be found filling in with others. She founded the trio Biophilliac along with guitarist Aaron

Failes, who are joined by drummer Marion Webb. Kat plays with Joshua Yarbrough and Memphis Bound as well as The Hero Band, and finally, with the country group Casper McWade & the Honky Tonk Rebels.

Kat's mother taught her to read music and she spent six years in the school band growing up in Coweta. Attending Tulsa University for three years, she played obo and saxophone in the marching band.

20-year-old Byron Crenshaw is the youngest artist, but one of the most talented, to receive a BCA. The bassist for Darrel Christopher and the Ingredients. Darrel describes his bassist as "a rising star." The young man was voted Mr. Hornet at Tulsa's

Booker T. Washington High School and is now attending the University of North Texas in Denton, on scholarship, majoring in Jazz Studies.



CD REVIEWS



Jason Elmore & Hoodoo Witch: CHAMPAGNE VELVET

Ever now and then you get surprised by listening to some new music. Jason Elmore & Hoodoo

Witch with their new CD Champagne Velvet was a very pleasant surprise indeed. They are a high energy classic trio that blends jam blues, rock, R&B and a little ole time country into a uniquely familiar sound that is the essence of the blues, while offering a fresh take on the genre.

Tracks of note are House Rockin' Boogie. Which kicks right out with a hot jump blues number. Cross-eyed Women features fabulous walkin' bass from Brandon Katona. Check out Land of *Plenty*, a Nashville shuffle about a tongue-in-cheek tale of a man "starving to death in the land of plenty" Jason Elmore vocals come from a deep well, and break out the resonator for the back porch lament on hard times on Green to Gone. This is great music, well played throughout, with lyrics all penned by Elmore. Kudos go to Underworld Records, whether you like roots music, or Texas style blues rock. You'll love these Dallas boys. Dustin Pittsley...(Continued from page 1) When discussing the new disc with Dustin and bandmate/

keyboardist Chris Kyle, he agreed this album was probably his most complete and natural sounding. When asked what he thought attributed to that progress, he simply answered, "The band I have right now really makes it easier to do that."

"With the last few records, it's always been Donnie (Wood, bassist) and me, but we've had different members and the others left everything up to me," he shared. "I've always written the songs, but the others never really contributed to the process. With this record, I wrote the songs and let the band work everything out and figure out their parts. We've been playing together for over two years now and I trust them."

"Two of us are good at identifying the problems, and two of us are good at finding the solutions," Kyle added with a laugh. "We've been playing together long enough and have built that chemistry where we know what works – and what fits for this band."

Heading into the New Year, Pittsley and his band will be heading to Memphis at the end of January to represent Tulsa in the International Blues Challenge. This won't be Pittsley's first time at the competition, but that doesn't lessen his anticipation of the event, although it does shape how he approaches it.

"A lot of people come to this thing looking to prove themselves or make a name for themselves in winning the competition - and I get that; but I really don't approach it that way," Pittsley explained. "For me, we've got a lot of friends out there, so it will be good to see them, and this is another way to keep my name out there and get more exposure for the band."

"Don't get me wrong," he was quick to add, "It's an honor to be going and we'd love to win, but we know straight off we're not rootsy enough to win it all. We'll play a mean blues set, though, and hope that keeps us in people's minds."

"The cool thing about the Blues Challenge is that there are so many people there that are truly at the top of their game," Kyle added. "The competition aspect of it is a little bit of a turn-off, but it's great to see people that are masters of their genre and make new friends."

"The blues is always a part of what we do, that will never change," Pittsley explained. "We can go to Knuckleheads in Kansas City and play a heavy blues set, but I've never really been pegged into one little corner. I like to be able to play a set that's more blues one night, then honky-tonk the next, then rock or R&B. I love them all, so why not?"

"One night when we played Buddy Guy's in Chicago we apologized after the first set and said 'I'm sorry, we'll play more blues the next set," Kyle added. "They said 'No - We love it when you play that twangy shit!"

"I remember talking to **Buddy Guy** the first time we played there," Pittsley shared, "and he told me 'Don't let anybody tell you what the blues is. If it's a guy playing the bagpipes, if it's the blues to him, then that's what it is.""

"Blues is such a broad term to me... If you put 'traditional' in front of it, yeah it makes it more restrictive, but it's so much more than that," Pittsley explained."

"The blues is always in my roots and part of what I do, but I'm just doing what comes naturally," he shared. "I've made a very modest living playing music and that's all I've ever really wanted to do. Looking back, I've been lucky as hell."

Pittsley's fans know that it's more than luck – he's one of the most talented and genuine artists in Oklahoma. And although he may not win the blues challenge this year, we're proud to have him representing us in Memphis and know he'll do more than "stay in people's minds" when he and his band tear up the stage with their new music

Ronnie Earl & The Broadcasters: MAXWELL STREET (Stony Plain Records) Just listened to Ronnie Earl & The

Markey Blue: THE BLUES ARE KNOCKIN' (SoulOSound Records)

Nashville Duo Markey and Ric Latina have created another rockin' blues delight with this second collection of original songs, including two tribute songs that are a couple of the bast tracks on the album: *L* an Dawn

that are a couple of the best tracks on the album; *Lay Down Lucille* written for **B.B. King** and *Be My Train* written for **Little Milton**. Excellent, smoky vocals and upbeat, rockin' performances, interlaced with outstanding guitar & session work. Three tracks from this album have even been selected for Movie/TV placement. Hard Swimmin' Fish:

Self-labeled as 'Twisted Vintage Roots' music; the rockin', blues harp tinged, upright bass thumpin', 20-year Virginia band **Hard Swimmin'**

Fish will conjure up The Black Keys, as they throw down an excellent fifth album of original performances and fine and funky music that's guaranteed to get your body swaying and your toes tapping. There's a couple of well-done covers within this collection as well including Howlin' Wolf's *Howlin' for My Darlin'* and *Mess Around*. 
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
