33rd International Blues Challenge

There's Nothing Like 265 Acts from Around the Globe "Bluzzin" on Beale Street

The big sign on Beale Street read, "Put a Little South in Your Mouth." Boy did we during the 33rd International Blues Challenge held January 31 – February 4 in the blues mecca of Memphis.

We got our fill of blues and food. (Pig on Beale- BBQ; King's Palace, steak; Blues City, everything is great; Flying Fish restaurant; Huey's, hamburgers). Took in a bunch of blues too!

Kudos to The Blues Foundation whose rather small staff spends the better part of every year putting this whole event together. This year there were 121 bands and 104 solo/duo acts competing to win the whole shebang. Add to that 40 acts in the youth showcase, plus available seminars, workshops, networking sessions, master classes and it becomes a matter of picking, choosing and pacing one's self to survive.

Between 3,000 and 4,000 fans were attending the IBC per day, according to the Blues Foundation, which says the event continues to grow.

With so many acts to choose from, many are performing simultaneously in the 21 venues, so there are tough decisions. So, a little priority was given to acts from sister blues acts in our area: Oklahoma City, Kansas City, and Ozark Blues Society of NW Arkansas and Wichita.

Our priority of course, was supporting Tulsa's IBC entry, the **Dustin Pittsley Band**, playing at the Rum Boogie Cafe. (Continued on page 5)

Bixby BBO n' Blues Festival: 7 Local Bands Slated for Fundraiser

Blues Divas of Tulsa, featuring three of the city's leading vocalists will headline the 16th Annual Bixby BBQ n' Blues Festival one evening and Tulsa's most decorated blues/rock band will close the show on the following night.

The Rotary Club of Bixby holds its biggest fundraising event of the year on Friday and Saturday, May 5-6 at Washington Irving Park, 137th and S. Memorial.

The Blues Divas of Tulsa have been voted a combined eight best vocalist of the year in the Blues Society's Blues Choice Awards and all front their own bands. Both Wanda Watson and Jennifer Marriott have capture three Best Vocalists awards, while Heather Buckley has two.

The **Dustin Pittsley Band**, which is touring in support of its sixth album release, will be the closing act on Saturday evening. The blues/rock group has 11 Blues Choice Awards for Band of the Year.

Playing for the first time at the Bixby event is **The Norman** Jackson Band from Springfield, MO. This blues and soul act placed third in the finals of the 2016 International Blues Challenge.

Another first timer at Bixby is The FuZed Band from Tulsa. This high energy cover band focuses more on funk, soul and rap influences.

The James Groves Blues Machine has represented Tulsa at the IBC as a band and its namesake has been to the IBC on Tulsa's behalf as a solo act. Darell Christopher & the Ingredients won the Tulsa Blues Challenge in 2015, which qualified it for the IBC.

Last but not least in the Dylan Whitney Band that represented Tulsa in the IBC Youth Showcase in 2016 and is one of the most highly regarded younger blues/rock bands around.


Jim Robinson, entertainment chair for the Bixby event recently wrote in an e-mail about a few changes this year. For example, only the main stage at the park will be used, with each band playing 75 minutes. Each act will be followed by a 30 minute intermission with music provided by Radio IDL. Headlining bands each evening will play 90 minutes.

"This event is our club's one big fundraiser so that we may continue to give back to the community," wrote Robinson.

While there is no entry fee, there is a \$10 per vehicle parking cost. There will be a live cooking show for attendees as well as food vendors.

There also will be numerous inflatable jumpers available at \$10 per child for an all-day pass. Plans include a petting zoo and a trackless train ride and pony rides.

The best Tulsa blues artists for 2016 will be honored and celebrated at an awards ceremony on Saturday, March 26th at Blackbird on Pearl, 1336 E. 6th in Tulsa. Simultaneously, there will be celebration by the Blues Society recognizing its 15th year as a 501 3 c non-profit whose primary mission is recognizing, supporting and promoting local blues artists and their music.

BCA recipients were chosen in voting by members of the Blues Society. All 11 winners have been invited to attend and perform during the evening.


Voted the Best Group of 2016 is **The Dustin Pittsley Band** featuring **Dustin Pittsley**, guitar/vocals, **Donnie Wood**, bass; **David Teegarden Jr.**, drums and **Chris Kyle**, keyboards. Also receiving awards will be **Dustin Pittsley** (Best Vocals); **Pete Marriott** and **Dustin Pittsley** (Best Lead) as well as **Byron Crenshaw**, **Kat Irons**, **Chris Kyle**, and **Matt Martin** (Best Rhythm).

The Dustin Pittsley Band will the host band and the other winners have been invited to perform. BCA winners are voted upon by members of the Blues Society.

We were exceptionally proud of their performances and there was a lot of stiff competition in that venue. No semi-finals this time for DPB.

Overall, about 15 acts were seen over three evenings. We'd like to especially congratulate **Brady Buster's One Man Band** from KC, who placed second overall in the solo/duo competition, plus received a Best Instrument award for harmonica.

Unless our sponsored act(s) reach the semi-finals or finals, the first evening (Wednesday) is always the favorite – because you don't have to fight the crowds so much, get decent venue seating, etc. Thursday is worse, and Friday – forget it.

We also made an enjoyable visit to the new and beautiful Blues Hall of Fame, where we admired the Blues Society's name engraved in stone on a wall for donating to the Raise the Roof fund building campaign. There's also a lot of cool displays and interactive touch screen displays – and of course two favorite sons of Tulsa and hall of famers, **Elvin Bishop** and **Lowell Fulsom**.

But there was a stroke of luck on Thursday since there was a desire to see this amazing talent from KC, **Amanda Fish.** Wet Willie's was packed for her show and your president was peering through the glass of a locked door looking like a penniless kid outside a candy store. Suddenly a man wearing Wet Willie's shirt told an employee that I was to be the last one let in this door. It resulted in a place right to the side of the stage witnessing what might be the next **Janis Joplin**, with an amazing band.

Tired of wall-to-wall humans, it was time for a change. Close by across the street was The Handy Bar, with an excellent house band, **The Amazing Rhythmics**. Even better, the place had seating!! It's one of the neat attributes of the IBC – some things not even a part of the big event are pretty darned good.

Not a better example of this was the next evening. After catching a few IBC acts, it was time to head to the Little Daisy Theatre where one of my all-time favorites, **Eric Gales**, was making a triumphant return to his home town following rehab. The icing on the cake was two surprise guests, **Kenny Neal** and **Walter Trout**!

By Saturday, our group of seven were pretty much toast and were ready to head home. In fact, the only year we have stayed for the finals was back in 2009 when our own **Little Joe McLerran** won the solo/duo competition at the beautiful, ornate Orpheum Theatre. That IBC was special for our Blues Society when you see such positive results from all the hard work. But this year was the most fun of all the IBCs attended. In February it seems you're fighting a cold, or allergies, and too often the bone chilling Memphis winter weather. This year none of those factors came into play.

By the way, we congratulate the 2017 band winner, **Dawn Tyler Watson** (Montreal Blues Society) and solo/duo winner **Al Hill** (Nashville Blues Society).

Catching our breath for a bit, but we're already starting the initial plans for our Tulsa Blues Challenge coming in August. If you've never experienced our Blues Challenge, or an IBC, put it on your bucket list. There's nothing quite like it.

*Mike Zito:*MAKE BLUES NOT WAR

(RUF Records)

I've been a **Mike Zito** fan and have purchased and play along to all of his guitar driven blues albums since I was asked to

review Mike's first big hit album *Pearl River*, back in 2010. This album is just as good as any Zito fan would expect; great original songs, blistering guitar work, and excellent session work from an outstanding studio band. Standout tracks are the lead off *Highway Mama*, which features **Walter Trout**, a pedal lover's dream *Red Bird*, and two biographical originals; *Chip off the Block* with Mike's son trading riffs with his old man, and every working musician's story *Road Dog*.

Mike Zito is my go-to artist when I wanna hear some inspiring blues guitar done right. Mike's a true triple threat with amazing songwriting, great vocals that keep getting better and better, and some of the most incredible guitar playing out there! Superb! - **Curt Fillmore (CurtsList.Com)**



The Fabulous Thunderbirds: STRONG LIKE THAT

(Severn Records)

The Fabulous Thunderbirds wouldn't and couldn't be the same band without **Kim Wilson's** amazing vocal style which made *Tuff Enough* and *Wrap It Up* two of the most

memorable soulful blues songs of the mid 80's. Kim's vocals and excellent harmonica playing are back on this 15th album of great covers and originals. Standouts include (I Know) I'm Losing You, featuring Roosevelt Collier and Wes Watkins; You're Gonna Miss Me, Drowning on Dry Land, and Smooth. The Thunderbirds have created yet another very tasty blues album! - Curt Fillmore (CurtsList.Com)



Gaetano Letizia: RESURRECTION

(Gaetano Letizia Music)

Here's a new jazzy blues album sure to please many guitar players out there that like to explore the different elements of today's blues music. This album features 14

tracks that boast an array of different beats, sounds, and techniques reinforced by an above average session band including a great horn section and Gaetano's impressive guitar performances. Other than technical merit however, I'm not sure this album will likely produce a hit, but it might definitely inspire one to take parts of these songs and turn them into something completely different. Levi Parham: THESE AMERICAN BLUES (Music Road Records)

Levi Parham is another one of these relative young Okies making waves with their exceptional

talent that continues the lineage of **Woody Guthrie** and more recently similar roads of **Wink Burcham** and **John Fullbright**. From McAlester, Levi combines blues, rock, folk and country. He has it all creating excellent songwriting, vocals and guitar. On *Steal Me* you can just image **Van Morrison** covering this song. *Gonna Be a Long Day* has a real country feel. This is his third album and first for Music Road Records and he has been touring in support of the release. A European tour is planned this year. *These American Blues* has excellent musicians including Tulsa's **Seth Lee Jones**. All but one of the 13 songs are originals, with Levi turning to Wink's great song, *Chemical Train*. Pick up this album because it's a gem. – **Bill Martin**



Katy Guillen & The Girls: HEAVY DAYS

(KG&G Records)

My first exposure to **Katy Guillen** (vocals, guitar), **Claire Adams** (bass, vocals) and

Stephanie Williams (drums, percussion) was earlier this year at The Colony. This is an excellent live blues/rock band. As the album title and the title cut indicates, this is an album of weighty lyrics and is sometimes a little depressing. I tend to focus on the Katy's fine vocals and the superb instrumental skills of the whole band. Based in Kansas City, I'm looking forward to their return to Tulsa. A favorite is *Waking Up from You*, with tempo changes. It was a night of passion, and battles where "I boiled over from the pot where we had stewed." *The* Load "will make you older" is another fine tune with a great guitar solo. You might say, Katy, spills her guts in this album. – Bill Martin



*Jeremiah Johnson Band:*BLUES HEART ATTACK

(Connor Ray Music)

Jeremiah Johnson Band is one of those fasten your seat belt, kick ass blues rock bands and has

some credentials to back up their music. JJ has won four blues challenges between competitions in Houston and his hometown of St. Louis. *Blues Heart Attack* is their sixth album and it reached



number 5 on the Billboard blues charts. Jeremiah (guitar, vocals) has those powerful **Pat Travers** type vocal chords and he cites **Alvin Lee** among his guitar influences. JJ has 12 original tunes on this record. While this is a hard driving band, you will find some rockabilly, boogie, Southern rock and slowed down more traditional blues for a change of pace. A very bold album. – **Bill Martin**



Mark May Band & The Soul Satyr Horns:

BLUES HEAVEN

(Connor Ray Music)

Reviewing guitar driven blues rock has got to

be one of my favorite things, especially when I get to hear new blues bands like this one. I had never heard of this band before this review but now I'm definitely a fan. Veteran artist **Mark May** is an amazing guitar player and vocalist. He's created a very tasty blues album chock full of great original songs, blistering guitar work, and an excellent session band featuring an outstanding horn section; The Soul Satyr Horns. Stand out tracks include *Money*, *Put Down That Poison*, *All I Ever Do*, and *Kind of Girl*. This one is a winner!

Deb Ryder: GRIT, GREASE & TEARS (Bejeb Music)

Here's some true blues in the tradition of two of her heroines, **Etta James** and **Koko Taylor**. This

is Chicago area native **Deb Ryder's** third release with her powerful, gritty vocals on full display. A favorite is the title cut *Grit*, *Grease* & *Tears* with her anguishing, "I can't take it anymore," with ace harmonica by **Bob Corritore** playing responsively. *Lord Knows I Do* is a beautiful ballad as Deb ponders her love for a man. *Panic Mode* features some fine West Coast funk and guitar picking with backing horns. – **Billy Austiny**


