STEVE WHITE GROUP IS NAMED BEST BAND FOR 2018

Also to be Honored at Blues Choice Awards: Beau Robinson, Dustin Pittsley, and Dave White. Story by Bill Martin



Steve White Group was voted Tulsa's Best Blues Group in 2018 by Blues Society of Tulsa members in the 15th Annual Blues Choice Awards. The band will be among several of Tulsa's finest musicians to be honored Saturday, March 23rd when the Blues Choice Awards event is held at Soul City. The event also will be a celebration of the Blues Society's 17th anniversary. The Steve White Group will be performing at the big party. Blues Choice Award winners from three other categories, Best Vocalist, Best Lead, and Best Rhythm also have been invited to accept the awards and perform.



Backing Steve are some of Tulsa's finest including Robert Day, B-3; Matt Martin, drums; Matt Leland, trombone; Dylan Layton, bass and Travis Fite, guitar.

Steve captured two BCAs last year, as Best Vocalist as a member of the James Groves Band that was named Best Group. A native Tulsan, Steve was guitarist for the late great Gus Hardin among others. He's also previously fronted his own band Supergroove and is the son of Tulsa music icon Don White.



BEST VOCALIST: Congratulations to **Beau Roberson**. Not only does he have a new baby girl, but he was voted 2018 Best Vocalist. He was part of the duo Beau and Wink (Burcham), but has become better known as founder and lead vocalist/rhythm for Pilgrim. He has released two albums of original material.

BEST LEAD: Over the years no artist has won more BCAs than Dustin **Pittsley**. This is the 10th Best Lead award for the blues/rock guitarist to go with his previous Best Band (11) and Best Vocalist (3) awards.

BEST RHYTHM:

Bassist and back up vocalist Dave White has built quite a resume over the years having been a part of the **Dwight**

URBAN – BIG CITY BLUES

Evolve or Be Left Behind

We know that sometime during the 1890's the Blues was born. The deceptively simple Blues became the most often used song structure. It's foundation was straight forward simplicity, sensuous familiarity and accepted openness.

The feeling of alienation transcended race and class in 20th century Urban America was given its voice by Blues singers.

URBAN Blues emerged after World War II. While the Delta-to-Chicago sounds of Muddy Waters and others clearly show an urban Blues style that evolved from a rural one, it is important to note that other city Blues developed parallel and apart from their country cousins. Deemed scandalous expressing urban experiences in lyrics with slang, shocking/journalistic matter-of factness reporting daily



drudgeries, dangers and sensual pleasures of city slum life including drug abuse and prostitution. It also empathized with card punching steel mill laborers. Notable Urban Bluesmen appeared bluntly cynical about love with a citified coolness and ironic humor.

Urban Blues artists are defined by the adaptability while maintaining a signature sound, whether this addition is horns or an electric guitar. They can update fluidity without compromising the music

personality and because of those changes the music appears timeless.

Lowell Fulson, aka Tulsa Red is a true example of an Urban Bluesman. This half Cherokee guitar artist was influenced by Texas Alexander, Blind Lemon Jefferson, Lonnie Johnson, Joe Turner and T-Bone Walker. His confident stage presence was

Old timey blues is what this record is bound to make the listener think of, with three of the most gifted singer, songwriter musicians on the planet today, playing the award winning instrument of choice for each; guitar with vocals, piano and harmonica. No electric firworks here, no drums, just a trio of musicians laying down some living room blues. The highpoints include some boogie-woogie style piano on You Got To Run Me Down And Chicago Breakdown. Another highlight is the amazing harp playing on G&J Boogie. Here's New Jersey guitarist, singer, songwriter Peter V's rockin', fourth blues release containing

rock, jazz and funk elements on guitar, some amazing Hammond organ, and sax playing coupled with Peter's vocals on 13 tracks; of which, are 9 new and original songs. Standout tracks include: In Demand, Alibi, Rodeo (No Bs), and Been so Long. Jim Allchin: PRIME BLUES

(Sandy Key Music LLC)

Jim Allchin is a Michigan born, blues/rock guitarist, computer scientist and former Microsoft executive currently promoting his fifth album

Prime Blues. Two time Grammy winner **Tom Hambridge** not only produced this record but plays the drums and helped write the 14 songs within including; Enough is Enough with Rock Blues Artist of the Year; **Mike Zito** taking the mic, and Two Bad Dreams featuring Blues Hall of Famer **Bobby Rush** on vocals. The supporting session musicians are all notable in their own right and compliment every track. Jim's Previous album; last year's Decisions, stayed on the blues rock album charts for 14 weeks. This new one may reset all his previous achievements. Standout tracks include: Give It Up (with the Memphis Horns), Voodoo Doll, Enough Is Enough, And Lost My Mind. Larkin Poe: VENOM & FAITH

(Trick-Woo Records)

That rockin' sisters blues due has done it again! (Often referred to as the Allman Brothers' little sisters.) This album definitely tops the last

great album they released which was 2017's Peach. (I reviewed that one too & it was awesome.) They were in Tulsa back in September performing during the opening week of the Gathering Place. Decendants of Edgar Allen Poe; The Atlanta born Lovell sisters, lead singer/guitar/mandolin/banjo/piano player Rebecca with harmony singer/lapsteel slide guitar player Megan; front the band and have taken their twist on contemporary blues to newer and greater audiences. It's southern style, acoustic rock, laced with unique percussion, beats and sounds, behind simply amazing vocal arrangements. Within just the past two or three years they have toured and opened for Elvis Costello, Bright Eyes, Sugarland, and Keith Urban among others. This entire album is a real joy to listen to. KERRY KUDLACEK: Historian of the Blues Society of Tulsa

Professor Kudlacek is a serious Americana collector since 1954. He believes knowing our musical roots is important – some is amazing – others not pretty – but all are important. A native of Oklahoma City, he moved to Tulsa over 40 years ago. He earned a B.A. and M.A. in Psychology with the majority of work completed for a Phd. His focus was primarily Clinical Psychology including 19 years at the Oklahoma Department of Human Services. His understanding of human nature and perception of sociological advances in music throughout American history is such an asset to our organization, as our historian. He is a "10" with us as truly an authority on Blues, Rhythm & Blues and those that gave us the Americana sounds.

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


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
